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Open source and free culture


The **four freedoms**:

- 0. The freedom to run/use for any purpose
- 1. The freedom to study and modify
- 2. The freedom to **copy and use to help others**
- 3. The freedom to improve and distribute to your community
- Cf. scientific method

Free culture is about sharing and social media – the remix


Free culture is defining the business and social environment
